

A Visit to the Commodious Quarters of the Bell Company.

A World reporter yesterday afternoon visited the quarters of the Bell telephone company in this city in the Mall building, and found everything there running in apple pie order.

The amount of system that has been introduced into the telephone business in this period that has elapsed since the discovery of this most useful invention is simply marvellous, and can only be appreciated by a personal inspection.

The merit of the system now used in the office here is the rapidity with which calls are answered, or rather connections made with the telephone desired.

4) For extending and widening Maule street on the frontage of premises in its present limits in equal proportion according to frontage, from Brock Avenue westward, and that portion of the street parallel to and abutting the railway lands on the property fronting on these streets, in equal proportions according to frontage.

5) For the opening of a street parallel to and abutting on said railway lands, connecting Maule street as extended with the proposed street from Brock Avenue westward, giving a continuous street from Brock Avenue to Emily street, and for assessing and levying the cost of the works as follows:
