

Ellicott-street, from Douge-sures to Note-ampton-street, 2061 square yards. The total number of square yards of asphalt pavement to be laid on the above-mentioned streets is 244,866. Besides this there are petitions pending the decision of the Common Council calling for an aggregate of about 500,000 additional square yards. Of this it is reasonable to assume that at least 200,000 square yards will be ordered paved. Add this to the 244,866 square yards and a total of 444,866 is the result. The basis taken for reckoning a lineal mile is 17,600 yards, granting that the average width of the street is 30 feet. By this reckoning there will be found to be a total of 25 miles and a fraction. 




