Accidentally Shot by Her Husband.

Glouce Bay, Nov. 12.—About twelve o'clock to-day Mrs. Campbell Atkinson met death from a rifle in the hands of her husband, Mr. Atkinson, who is a member of the recently formed Rifle Club of Glouce Bay, was making preparations to attend a preliminary practice. He had filled some of the chambers of his rifle and supposed it was loaded. His wife was in the boat with him when the rifle discharged; a bullet struck the unfortunate woman just above the thigh, passing through the bowels out the other side and into the walls of the room. The woman sank to the floor, while her husband rushed for medical assistance. She survived the shock for about an hour before expiring. Mr. Atkinson and his wife were very popular and the keenest sympathy is felt throughout their acquaintance. Mr. Atkinson, who is completely stunned by the tragedy, is a locomotive driver on the Sydney and Annapolis railway, and comes from Montreal. Mrs. Atkinson was a young woman of about 30 years of age, and leaves two young children, the eldest being but a year and a half old. She was a daughter of Engineer Parsons, who was killed at Mira Gut at the time locomotive No. 62 was wrecked in the open draw last summer.
