### Sale of the Aylesby Herd.

A good deal of Short-horn history has been made during the last few weeks. The excitement caused by the reach ing of the highest average by Lord Dunmore has scarcely subsided when wonder is again raised by the attainment of the highest price ever yet given in England for a female Short-horn, one of the Aylesby herd. The latter sale came off on the premises of the late Mr. Torr, on Sept. 2nd. The result of it shows that Booth cattle have as ardent admirers as the Bates, and indeed the sale may be said to occupy to the Booths the same place as Lord Dunmore's sale does the Bates. A notable occurrence at the Aylesby sale was the purchase of £12,000 worth by Mr. T. C. Booth, of Warlaby.
