THE INFLUENCE OF THE HEBREW MIND ON THE WORLD. PART III.

(Concluded from last number, page 43.)

The third and last part for consideration is, the influence of the Hebrew mind on the future.

To foretel events requires the qualifications of a prophet; and therefore, when we lift the veil that hangs between the vision and the fact, and which conceals the actual future of the Jews, it is by the aid of sacred prophecy alone that we can do it, and from the whole series of revelation
