CONSIDERATION OF AMENDMENT METHOD AT DOMINION-PROVINCIAL CONFERENCE

On the orders of the day:

Mr. Stanley Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Mr. Speaker, may I direct a question to the Prime Minister. Has the subject of finding a way in which to amend the Canadian constitution in Canada been placed on the agenda for the meeting of the federal government with the provinces in Charlottetown early in September; and can the Prime Minister tell us anything further with regard to this matter at this time?

Right Hon. L. B. Pearson (Prime Minister): Mr. Speaker, I think I have already announced that this is a matter which will be discussed at Charlottetown at the federal-provincial meeting, although that meeting will be primarily ceremonial in character to commemorate the one hundredth anniversary of the Charlottetown conference. This is the only matter on the agenda at the moment, and it will be discussed there.

Mr. Knowles: As a supplementary question, Mr. Speaker, if agreement is reached to arrange for the constitution to be amended in Canada, will the necessary enactment be made in another country or will it be made in Canada as a sign of our sovereignty.

Mr. Pearson: Mr. Speaker, I am sure it will have to be made in the proper constitutional way. I would like to look into the matter to find out what that way is, and perhaps I could say something about it tomorrow.

JAPAN-CONTROL OF FABRIC EXPORTS TO CANADA
