The experience of modern ages prefents no example of a country oppreffed beneath fo fuperior a combination of enemies, as the British compire had suftained for many years. The league of Cambray in the fixteenth century, or the great alliance formed in the beginning of the prefent century, for reducing the exhorbitant power of Louis the XIVth, prefent only a feeble image of the more univerfal and incredible efforts made to fhake the foundations of the English grandeur, and which have been attended with too much fuccefs. The convultions which overturned the Republic of Venice, and fhook the throne and monarchy of France, were in a great degree confined to Europe, and to the continent of the Old World; but we were deflined to fee America and Afia unite their forces, and extend the horrors of war over the most remote extremities of the planet, through every latitude, embracing both hemispheres, and involving the world
