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in all Respects it would have had
the contrary Effect, in keeping
the Crown from Surprise, in hav-
ing the Orders of the Crown duly
executed, and in freeing the
Subject from many Acts of Op-
pression; and if those in Trust and
Power in the Colonies deviated
from their Duty, the Subject, if
injured, could lay his Grievan-
ces before the Crown, without
being liable to any great Delay
and Expence therein.

And there is the greater Rea-
son for this Course of Proceeding,
as the Crown has not thought fit,
usually, to admit of Appeals for
any Sum less than 300 *l.* Sterl.
but
