It may with 'ruth be faid of him, he has lett nos Foe in the Britith Fimpire, that was not fo to his Country; that Humanity lie port. feffed in a very entinent Degree, having ne. ver figned a Warrant without feeling for the Man : Few of his Predectlors equalled han in Moderation; in P'e'y and Juftice, nune. His Reign was long and bappy, and clofed with a Sties of elorious Events, fuch as will amaze l'olterity. In him were united the King, the Hero, and the Chiltian; which fecured to himan unbounded Vere. sation thro' Life, and to be gealty rearetted at Desth, hy a loya and a grateful P'ople; whon would have Ili! greater Reafon 10 deplere his loof, had we not the pleafing bope, that his Crown is the leaft vatuabie Lesacy he has left. Ite is fucceeded on the Imperial 'throne of the fe Realins by his Reyal Giandicn, our prifent Gracious Sovereisn, Cemge rie Third, to whom, God grant Length of Yeass, and a profpelous keign over a layuy and contented leceple.

And this Day, about Noon, his Mrjefty was prochamed, frat before Saville-Huve, where the Othcers of State, Nobility, and Privy Counctllors, were prefent, wall the Officers of Arms, all being on Foot: Then the Othicess of Arms being mownted on Horfeback, the like was done at (hatingCrofs: withon Tenple Bar ; at the End of Wood-Atect in Cherapfice; and lafty, at the Royal Exchmes ; with the ufusl Solem.. nitics: The pracipal Onicers of State, a great Number of the Nobility, and of ether perfons of diftmation, atterding during the whole Coremeny.
