In compliance with the Law, the Battalion will parade on the Esplanade, St. Lewis-street, on Saturday, the 29th day of June, instant, at 6 o'clock, A. M.

The Officers commanding Companies, will, on the receipt of this order, proceed to the enrolment of all the effective men of their respective divisions, from the age of 18 to 59 inclusive ; and on Friday, the twenty-eighth day of June, instant, order every Militia-man, so enrolled, to attend such parade, or cause it so to be done by the officers or non-commissioned officers of their companies.

Officers commanding Companies shall, immediately after parade, send to the Lieutenant-Colonel commanding, a parade return, with copy of the roll of their companies, adhering strictly to the form herein inclosed.

The Battalion will form for parade in open column of companies, the right in front, the left of each company resting on the camp color, bearing the number of the company ; the roll of each company will be called at half past six.

Every officer shall appear on parade in the undress uniform of the battalion, viz : Surtout, white drill trowsers, forage-cap, regulation sword, steel scabbard and belt.

It is expected that on that day every officer will have finally settled his accounts with the Pay and Quartermasters of the battalion, as their books are to be laid before the commandant for inspection.
