

turn to God, or induce the believer to walk more closely with Him, without that divine agency which alone can render them effectual. Paul claimed not this power, either for himself or his eloquent companion and fellow-labourer, Apollos; but still the one continued to plant and the other to water, in the faith that God would give the increase. The Almighty still works by means; and the great means which he has appointed to gather in and edify his church are the exhibition of Christ in the Gospel, and the appeals contained in his holy word. I look to the same all-potent influence on which they rested, to render the gospel to you the *power of God unto salvation*; and *my heart's desire and prayer for you all is, that you may be saved.* Amen.
