GREAT BILLY KELLY BEATEN BY ETERNAL

Schuttinger Outrides Sande in Great Two-Year-Old Event.

Laurel, Md., Oct. 28.—Eternal won the six-furlong race for a purse of \$20,000 and the John H. MacLean Memorial Cup at Laurel today, beating Billy Kelly by a head.

The time was 1 minute 12 seconds. The race was accompanied by scenes of wild enthusiasm, and the monster crowd stood yelling as the horses came down the stretch.

Eternal took the lead almost immediately after the start, and kept it for a few rods, Schuttinger, on Eternal, closed his horse into great speed and nosed ahead at the barrier. The winner paid \$4.40 to win.
