Imported Nursery Stock.

Instructions From Ottawa to Detail That Received Since March 17—Order Affects British Stock.

The local customs authorities received instructions from Ottawa yesterday to detail all nursery stock imported since March 17 and to notify outposts in this district to that effect at once. This includes rose bushes and other stock imported from England, while the regulation of the department at Ottawa has reference only to nursery stock from the United States, Japan and Hawaii.

CHALMERS WAS A FIGHTER.

A Negro Attacked by a Mob Made a Vigorous Defense.

Mississauga, L. N., March 21.—The house of Edward Chalmers, a negro, who recently married a white woman, was attacked at Wyback, five miles from here, last night by six white men, who evidently determined to murder both the negro and his wife, both of whom had been threatened by white men who disliked the union. The door of their cabin was broken in, and both the negro and his wife were shot down, but the latter survived. Chalmers had made a fight against his assailants. The woman was killed outright, and though Chalmers succeeded in driving off the attacking party, they left him mortally wounded, and he died before daylight. This morning the body of one Matthews, an aged white man, was found near the Chalmers cabin, pierced with a bullet.

NICKEL AND INSOLVENCY.

Two Questions Before the Board of Trade Council Yesterday.

At a meeting of the Council of the Board of Trade yesterday a communication from the secretary of the Board of Trade regarding proposed harbor improvements at the port of Montreal was read, and the Council instructed Secretary Willis to arrange for a general meeting of the Board, to be addressed by Mr. Thomas McCreath, the representative in Canada of the Elder-Dempster Company.

Mr. John Patterson of the Nickel Steel Company of Canada, who, speaking on behalf of the Board to use its influence in securing the imposition of an export duty on nickel ore and the town of Sudbury sent a copy of the resolution protesting against such a duty.

The Council, after considerable discussion, referred the whole question to a special committee, consisting of Messrs. W. C. Bate, W. E. Matthews, H. E. B. Bate, and J. E. B. Bate.

The special committee on Municipal Taxation presented its report, which being long to read, the secretary was ordered to prepare copies of it for the benefit of the members of the Council. It is understood to favor the adoption of a business tax, special meeting of the Council to be held next Monday, when they will deal with the question in detail.

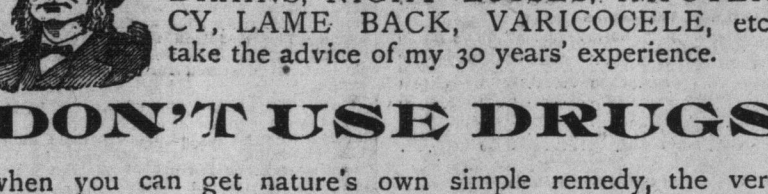
