WHEAT OPTIONS

Demand for Cash Article Greater Than Supply.

Liverpool Cables Higher—Russian

Wheat Crop Said to be Largely a

Failure—Details of United States

Government Crop Report—Gossip

and Notes.

Friday Evening, Aug. 12.

Higher cables from Liverpool and

reports of the destruction of a great part

of the Russian crop, together with a strong

demand and light receipts at home

brought about an elevation in the price

of wheat at Chicago today. The cash

article advanced over a cent per bushel,

the number of calls for the article being

240,000 bushels, the latter being 140,000

bushels. The close was about at the

top price for the day.

TORONTO FRUIT MARKET.

Receipts of fruit were light and trade

fair. Prices steady at following quotations:

Lawson berries 40c to 50c, blueberries 50c

to 60c, peaches 40c to 50c, apples 40c to

50c, tomatoes 40c to 50c, cucumbers 20c to

30c, peppers 20c to 30c, melons 20c to 30c,

onions 40c to 50c per bushel.

The Niagara Fruit Growers' Co. had ap-

ples of the Duchesne variety of excellent

quality, the best of the season, which they

were selling at \$1.50 to \$1.75 per bushel.

LOCAL LIVESTOCK.

The run of live stock at the Market to-

day was large—77 carloads, consisting

of 1,700 hogs, 1,017 sheep, 101 calves

and lambs and 75 calves.

The cattle, generally speaking, were

not reported in large numbers, but a few

peculiarly selected. Too many unfinished

cattle that it would have paid the farmer

to have had some of his surplus in the

city, coming forward, and prices were

consequently low.

Exporters sold at \$1.25 to \$1.40, the

bulk going at \$1.25 to \$1.30 per cwt.

Importers sold at \$1.25 to \$1.30 per cwt.

Heavy bulls of choice quality \$3.50 to \$4.00

per cwt.

Good butchers and exporters mixed

stock sold at \$1.25 to \$1.30 per cwt.

Butchers' stock sold at \$1.25 to \$1.30

per cwt.

There were about 25 milk cows, the

quality of which was not as good as usual,

and prices were easier, ranging from \$2.50

to \$4.00 each, the average price being about

\$3.50.

There was a large number of feeders and

stockers, especially the latter, many of

which were not sold, but consigned through

Feeders sold from \$3.50 to \$3.75, and

stockers of choice quality, weighing 1100 lbs.

each, mixed with advancing price.

Prices for stockers were firmer, selling

at \$3.25 to \$3.50, the bulk going at \$3.25

to \$3.50, common at \$3.12 to \$3.37, and

inferior \$3 to \$3.25 per cwt.

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
