Missions in China were in a bad way, owing to the outbursts of native violence. Medical hospitals had been opened in West China. Japan showed a slight gain in the number of converts, though many opposing influences were at work there. The work among the Indians had been very successful, though the hope of establishing a separate branch of the church among them would probably be futile. The educational features were en-tering upon a new era. The subject of medical missionaries was treated at length.
