Will Not Take His Seat.

The Chief Justice of Camada, Sir Henry Strong, was absent from the bench of the Supreme Court this morning, and, it is stated that he will not take his seat during the hearing of the Ontario list. His absence at any time would attract attention, but especially now, when the recent action of the Quebec bar is in everybody's mind. Considerable surmise is indulged in, and it is stated that his absence from the bench is due to the presentation to the Minister of Justice, in June last, of a protest against the Chief Justice's behavior, from the bar of Ontario, and a request for bis removal. Rumor also says that the Ontario bar, through Mr. B. B. Osler, Q.C., who was the chief mover in the protest, received an assurance that the Supreme Court beach would be remodeled at an early date. The remodeling will, it is said, consist of the superannuation on full pay of the Chief Justice and Mr. Justice Gwynne, and the appointment of three new Ontario judg 28, one of whom shall be an Ontario man, sitting on the Manitoba bench.


