According to word received here, Great Britain will at once begin the most searching and most complete inquiry into the affair.

There is reason to believe that the British embassy was acquainted with information which reached the Russian authorities some time ago of the arrival of the submarine torpedo boat.

It is explained here that an enquiry would not involve a delay in the voyage of the squadron as the denouement of the officers could be taken. At the admiralty there is a feeling of great relief over Rojdestvensky's explanation, and rejoicing at the fact that there was another side to the affair is vindicated.
