75 yards—7 secs. by W Bingham, proprietor of the Hub, Toronto, run at Middletown, N Y. 7 2-5 secs by H M Johnson at Williamsburg, Aug 13, 1884. The fastest in Canada for same distance is 7½ secs by Tisdale at Toronto, Nov. 17, 1884.

100 yards—9¼ secs by George Seward, (American) Turnpike Road, Hammersmith, Sept 1844. (This was run down hill and is not accepted as a technical record.) The best authenticated record is 10 secs, by a good many.

125 yards—12½ secs, by M M Kittleman at Pittsburg, August 18, 1884, and by J W Cozad.

150 yards—15 secs, by George Forbes (Canadian) at Providence, R I, Dec 20, 1869, by C Westhall and W P Phillips, London, (Eng) 1880. Also by H M Johnson at Titusville, Pa., Oct 18, '83, and W C Wilbur at Milburn, N Y, Oct 6, '78.
