with the same remedies as the city rate upon personal property. It is unlikely that anyone will be able to escape it who is liable. In addition to the assessment plan to collect this tax, a general warrant may be issued for the collection of the tax by distress and sale of goods of the person named and for want of goods of such person whereon to levy he may be committed to jail. Any person so committed shall be entitled to all the privileges of a debtor imprisoned under civil process.

It had been originally proposed to make every firm or employer in the city liable for the tax of their employes. The plan was to empower the employer to keep the amount of the tax off the earnings of those whom he had in his employ liable for the tax. This was not considered fair. H. S. Employers are required on request to furnish the assessor with the name of every person in his employ in receipt of a yearly salary or income of \$700 or

a yearly salary or income of \$700 or over.

Lists have been already received from practically all business places in the city and is quite a large one.

An inducement is offered for those who pay promptly. If the tax is paid on or before the 30th day of September, the person paying, it he is a British subject, shall be entitled to a vote at the next ensuing elections for mayor, controller or alderman in the city; and the names of all persons who have so paid shall be added by the collector to the list of persons entitled to vote.

The assessors shall add to the list of names of persons liable to poll tax on the first day of August in each year, the name of every person so liable who takes up his residence within the city between the first December and the first September next succeeding.

In submitting a statement of yearly income for income tax every employer is required to state the yearly wage of his employes liable, either income, personal property, real estate. This information is to be given in a sworn statement.

NEED STRUCTURAL STEEL

Contracts for \$500,000,000 Demand Material, Organization Asserts

Chicago, Oct. 5.—Contracts for \$500,-000,000 have been let in the iron and steel industries as the first development of the biggest boom in the history of the Central Western States, it was brought out at the final session of the Structural Steel Society.

The society considered the situation as one that presaged unprecedented prosperity for all workers, regardless of the outcome of the presidential election.

"Never at any time in our economic life has the United States experienced such an expansion of building," said President F. W. Ives of Decatur.

His summary was based on reports furnished by the secretary, A. L. Denniston of Rochester, Ind., to the effect that structural men throughout the country were unable to get sufficient supplies of iron and steel to construct bridges and steel skeletons for buildings, and to engage in the industries that require this material. Mr. Ives added:

Ind., to stimulate the mills to turn out more product. We have communicated with mills throughout the country the fact we must have structural materials to meet the great demand."
