SIR GEO. E. FOSTER ON "WAR AND PATRIOTISM"

Sir George E. Foster, minister of trade and commerce, delivered an address on "Patriotism and the War" in the Imperial Theatre on Sunday afternoon. Mayor Hayes presided and among those on the platform were the commanding officers of the 168th and 22nd Battalions, the Field Ambulance and Siege Battery, and also Senator Thorne, Sir Thomas Esmond, M. P., and Judge McInerney. A vote of thanks was tendered also to the 168th Band which rendered a musical programme. In his address Sir George gave a serious warning that the war is far from won and that we are fools if we think that Canada has done her full duty. He commented on the fact that Quebec has given only 89,000 men.

Perhaps the best stage production seen in St. John in recent years was "The White Feather," in which Albert Brown, the distinguished Canadian actor, appeared at the Opera House last April. Mr. Brown, after successful engagements in Montreal, Toronto and other large cities, is again here in St. John and opens a three days' engagement at the Opera House tonight in his new play, "The Black Feather," a comedy drama written by the veteran Canadian dramatist, W. A. Tremayne of Montreal. It is a story of the British War Office and the British Secret Service and the Montreal and Toronto newspapers have unanimously endorsed it as even a better play than Mr. Brown's success of last year.

PLANS ORTHOPAEDIC WORK FOR CANADA

Lieut.-Col. Starr Prepares to Set up Hospitals in Dominion—Remarkable Cures Effected in England

London, Nov. 9.—Lieut.-Col. Clarence Starr, of Toronto, who has had charge of the orthopaedic work of Canada, is now at the Canadian special hospital in Ramsgate, preparing for setting up in Canada several similar institutions. Col. Robert Jones, director of the military orthopaedic branch in Great Britain, is establishing hospitals similar to the Canadian hospital at Ramsgate all over Britain.

Canada thus has led the way on the most successful medical enterprises of war. Amongst the recent striking cures at Ramsgate is that of Corporal Hogan, an employe of the Grand Trunk, who was twice wounded at Ypres. He was buried alive during the Somme operations while following the tanks. When rescued he had lost his speech, hearing and taste. After ten minutes treatment through mental suggestion at Ramsgate his deafness and dumbness had vanished and he has since recovered his sense of taste. Another man named Villen-shell, who was struck blind by a star shell, went fourteen months from hospital to hospital fruitlessly. Eventually he reached Ramsgate where special treatment restored his sight. He is now on active service again in France.

LOWER PROVINCE MEN IN BLACK'S YUKON COMPANY
