Toronto, July 19—The Ontario department of agriculture yesterday issued the following summary:
Good progress with harvesting operations is reported from all parts of Ontario. Wheat is prectically all cut and a good start has been made on the barley. Only a few oats have been cut and they will be ready any day now. An anomaly is noted in western Ontario where in some instances the wheat is harvested before the haying is done. This is because wheat ripened so early that farmers had to leave the haying to take care of it and have not yet been able entirely to complete the haying.
