MUNICIPALITIES UNION TO TAKE IN WHOLE CONTINENT

toposal That May Be Taken up
at Canadian Industrial Congress
in Calgary

Calgary, Aug. 1.—Headquarters of the Canadian Industrial Congress is in receipt of communications from municipalities on both sides of the international border commending a proposal for a union of municipalities. The proposal is being sent out from the headquarters of the congress, which is being held at the Hotel Macdonald, as a consequence of the chief executive of every municipality of importance in the United States and Canada.

ances from a large number of the leading municipalities of the continent that representatives will be present, and that in many instances there will be good-sized delegations.
"It has been suggested that a vast union of municipalities, to include the cities and towns of the continent without regard to international boundary line, could do more to cement proper international relationships than any other agency, that it could be a powerful factor in the matter of industrial expansion along proper lines, transportation, good roads, construction, catalog of conventions, and a proper spirit of co-operation generally.
"Such a union could do more to direct public sentiment of both countries along normal and national channels than any other factor, would tend to remove factionalism, provincialism and the narrower spirit of envy in competition.
"Should such a union be one of the results of this great congress, it is pointed out that your city should take its important part. Let me urge that you have a strong delegation present.
"Would you be good enough to give by return mail your opinion and the opinion of your city council as to the advisability of a movement such as here outlined?

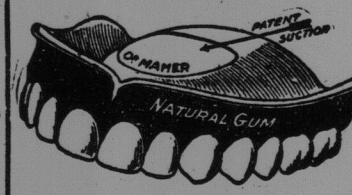

BOUGHT FARM FOR CAPT. KIDD'S LOOT

Pirate's Spook Gave Him the Tip,
Seller Said

Trenton, N. J., Aug. 1.—Capt. Kidd's spirit is not a reliable witness as to where the redoubtable pirate buried his treasure, in the opinion of Sophie Sumter and Marie Blumer of Peterson, and Fred Laeche of Elizabeth, who appealed to the supreme court yesterday against both the spook and his alleged sponsor, Daniel Baisinger, of Oakland, N. J.
The three took a chance and bought a farm from Baisinger in May, 1918, on the strength of his assurance that Capt. Kidd's spirit had appeared to him in the night and revealed the exact spot on the farm where he had buried whole chests of pieces of eight, doubloons and other treasures pirates were wont to collect.
To bind the bargain, the purchasers paid \$200 in cash and gave their note for \$5,000. They do not wish to pay the note now because they have dug up the entire farm without finding a single doubloon. They asked the court to declare the note void on the ground that it was agreed with Baisinger that the \$5,000 was to be paid out of the treasure.

SOVEREIGN GRAND LODGE OF BRITISH AMERICA

Ottawa, July 31.—Discussion on the resolutions of the committee on by-laws and the insurance branch occupied the whole session of the Sovereign Grand Lodge of British America at the annual convention this morning.
The resolution of the committee on insurance calls for a substantial increase in the premiums for those who took out policies prior to 1906.
This has been instructed in order to put the insurance branch on a solid basis. Fully one-half of the membership of this branch, are according to Grand Master H. C. Hocken, on an absolutely sound basis. The discussion this morning brought forth many arguments both for and against the proposed changes. It is expected that the resolution will carry at the meeting of the delegates tomorrow morning.

Purse for Bishop Fallon.
London, Aug. 1.—Bishop Fallon, head of the Catholic diocese of Huron, has received a purse of \$7,000 and a check for \$170,000 for the building of a seminary in this city. The presentation was made on the twenty-fifth anniversary of Bishop Fallon's entrance into the priesthood.
