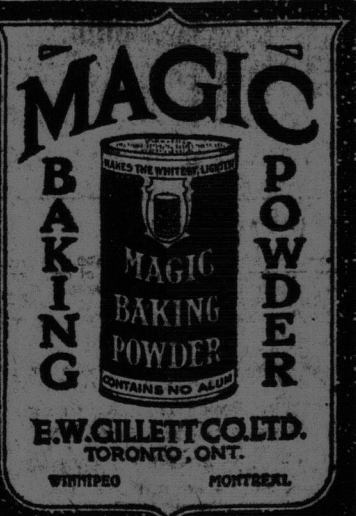

THE GUTELIUS CAR

(Moncton Transcript)

According to questions put in parliament by Mr. Michael, the observation car "Dufferin," which is now being dismantled and rebuilt as an official car for Mr. Gutelius, was originally built about 1905, at a cost of \$17,500, and that it had been used as a spare parlor car during the past eight years. It is pretended that this car "Dufferin" is being refitted over to replace official car No. 75, which was destroyed in the great fire, eight years ago. It is very curious that the I. C. R., which could get a new car by replacing official car No. 75, for eight years, now finds it necessary to replace it by taking an old car, apparently of the scanty number of cars available for the travelling public.

Sunday Fires

The two-family dwelling at 91 Moore street owned by Charles H. Ramsey, and occupied by him and by Roy Courtney, was badly damaged by fire early Sunday morning. The damage is estimated at about \$1,000 loss on the house with considerable damage to the contents. The insurance on the house, included \$1,000 in the Royal and \$1,000 in the London. Mr. Ramsey carried \$200 on his furniture with William Thomson & Co, and Mr. Courtney had the same amount with the same firm.

George B. Leckie's building, Inglis street, Truro, was badly damaged by fire last night. The tenants of the building who will also suffer from the destruction of their stocks and equipment are George's Bakery, loss \$500; Miss Ballie, milliner, \$280, and Pitkavich's confectionery, \$500. Earlier in the evening a fire in F. W. Foster's residence was extinguished before serious damage was done.
