Boston. Sept. 12—Mayor Fitzgerald last night, referring to the proposition of the milk producers to charge 40 cents a can for milk and by so doing raise the price to the consumer to 10 a quart, said that District Attorney Pelletier and the United States District Attorney should take the matter up and investigate as to whether or no there is collusion.

"Milk," said he, "has become such a necessary article of food that stringent laws or regulations should be made for its handling. There is justice on the side of the producers in their claim that 'they do not get enough for their milk, just as there is justice in the kicks of the consumers against the high cost. The middleman should be wiped out and the milk sold directly to consumers.

"Under the present system milk is delivered here in Boston from all parts of Vermont, New Hampshire and even from Canada, with the result that when it reaches the consumer's table it is three or four days old. And yet, by some manner of means they seem to get by. I don't hope to accomplish much because there is so much money behind the contractors. The state should step in and run it. The milk goes to the poor man's table and ought to be reasonable."


