Cush gave his reasons for resigning from cabinet in a brief, concise manner. He was followed by the premier, who ocked horns with him on the question as to whether Mr. Cushing was pres nt when the agreement was signed, On this point the two not only failed o agree, but flatly contradicted J. R. Boyle was forced to enter on
