It is estimated that since the call of the Secretary of War for more troops to defend Washington, upwards of 75,000 additional men have been sent from the North.

The immense numbers of troops now at the Capital and the reliance which they place on Gen. McClellan's ability, make the Northern very confident of the next battle.

It is said that the Southern intend attacking Washington by a flank movement, the design being to use a large force, which, it appears, has been concentrating for a long time in Maryland.

It has been discovered that they have erected formidable batteries on Aquia and Potomac creeks and even on the Maryland side of the river at Mineral Point.
