Hamel prophesied the glacier would yield them up in the course of a thousand years, but Forbes believed that the end of the glacier would be reached by the bodies in 40 years. This statement was considered bold, but its accuracy was borne out by the event. In 40 years the flow of ice brought the bodies to light.

In 1856 Henry Arkwright was lost in a glacier. In just 31 years his brother received a telegraffic from the mayor of Chamounis stating that the body had been found. Every stitcle of clothing was intact. His name and regiment could be read clearly on his handkerchief, and his gold pencil case opened and shut as easily as when he had last used it, three decades before.
