German Counter-Attack on Americans on Marne Ends in Failure and Virtual Annihilation of Assaulting Force—Hot Fighting in Front of Hill 204—Many Prisoners Taken.

Rome, July 2-Italian forces this morning launched an attack against the Austrian positions in the region of the Grappa, on the mountain front, and captured important positions, the war office announces. The Italians took 569 prisoners, including nineteen officers and captured Austrian

The Austrians yesterday delivered fresh attacks against Italian positions on the Asiago Pla(au, says today's war office report. The enemy efforts were smashed by the Italian fire, which caused the enemy severe losses.

In counter-attacks to clear advance points temporarily penetrated by small parties, the Italian troops were completely successful, capturing 127 prisoners, four trench cannon and several machine guns.
