American Ports. New York, Feb. 10-Ard str Stavanger St. John. Cleared Feb. 11, str La Canadensis, St. John. Wind, Feb. 10-Ard str G. A. Flaxie, Halifax.

Foreign Ports. Genova, Feb. 1-Ard str Valura, St. John, N. B. A Total Loss. Schooner W. N. Zwicker (Br), from Norfolk, Dec. 24, for Para, struck and entering the Para River and is reported a total loss.

Steamer Ashore. Steamer Valmore (Br), from Havre for Baltimore, arrived at Bermuda with loss of two blades of her propeller. She later dragged ashore during a heavy gale.

City Island, N. Y., Feb. 11-Schr Ada Mac (Br) from Parramore for New York, reports Feb. 9, while anchored off Pollock Pier, during heavy wind and rain, struck and lost anchor and 20 fathoms of chain.

The rescue at sea of the str and ten men of str Flirt, which with its cargo of coal, was destroyed recently by fire in Southern waters, was announced in a wireless message to New Savannah, which apparently found the 11 men adrift in their small boat. The captain and 17 men of the Flirt landed at Calcas on Feb. 2.

Schooner Waterlogged. Key West, Feb. 10-Sir J. A. Bostwick, from New York, Feb. 3, for Port Lobos, landed 7 of crew of schr Charlevoix (Br), from St. Andrews, which was waterlogged in lat 27 N, lon 75 W. Master declined to leave vessel.

The Charlevoix is last reported as sailing from St. Andrews, Florida, for Macoris, on January 20, having arrived there from the latter port on December 26th. The Charlevoix was a schooner of 427 tons net, and 469 tons gross. She was built at Piquette, N. S., by Jas. E. Pettis, in September, 1899. Her dimensions are: Length, 154 feet; beam, 34.2 feet; depth, 12.8 feet. It is thought that she is stranded in Mobile by Pace and Jones.

Dangers to Navigation. Steamer Gorontala, from Pauillac for Hampton Roads, reported by radio Feb. 9 at 10 p.m. missed derelict schr Joseph P. Cooper (before reported abandoned), in lat 35 06 N, lon 68 40 W.

Feb. 4, lat 37 49 N, lon 74 58 W, submerged wreck, with a temporary cage with a flag on top.

IRON AGE PREDICTS DROP IN PRICES TO INCREASE TRADE The Iron Age, in discussing the outlook, will say today in its "Iron Market Summary": "The cutting of prices is now being admitted by producers as necessary to kindle the interest of buyers. How to get labor to recognize its part in the adjustment is the problem. The low total of the present inflow of emergency orders points to shut downs here and there in two or three months' time. Meanwhile the buying elements need to remember that the country is proceeding on the theory that it is no longer an isolated nation. Fixed iron and steel export prices of England, its chief competitor for the world's markets, are anywhere up to forty per cent. higher than its own. A mile of 4,000 tons of pig iron is noted for export and Cleveland reports an inquiry for 5,000 tons for China. On 300 tons a cut of \$1.80 from \$1 a ton was made by an East ern furnace, but 3,000 tons for Italy was withdrawn on the price account. The demand of the automobile trade is the outstanding feature of the domestic market. Sheet mills are running at 75 per cent. of capacity, mostly for motor cars and trucks. Some alloy steel makers are booked for six weeks.

Steel sheet production for January was 2,382,427 tons, or 90,000 tons more than December. Some test of market ideas will be made on February 18, when bids will be received against a navy inquiry for 16,000 tons of plate and shapes. A large Detroit truck maker is sounding the alarm on his structural products to the extent of 15,000 tons. Surplus production of coke has resulted in cuts of 75c, and \$1 a ton, prompt furnace coke selling at \$125.

STMR. MAGDALENE HIT BY FIRE

Halifax, Feb. 13.-The steamer Magdalene, which conducts a coastal service between Arochet and other Cape Breton ports and which went on the marine slip here a few days ago for repairs, was badly damaged by fire this morning. Ships Engineer Rheinhart was severely burned about the face and hands and was removed to the Victoria General Hospital.

THINK GRAIN TRADE DEPENDS ON CREDIT Wheat Market Awaits Foreign Export Financing - Corn and Oats Advance.

New York, Feb. 13.-The impression is gaining ground in the grain trade that the outlook for the American who surplus next season is going to depend on the establishing of credits with importing countries abroad. As far as the price for next season's crop is concerned, any figures that are named at the present time are speculative and should not be given serious consideration.

The corn market developed a firmer tone and prices closed at about the best of the day with net gains of 1/4 cent, a 2c. Cash markets in the west were 2c. higher, and a more confident feeling prevailed throughout the trade. The movement at primary points were slightly larger, but still far below last year, when at this time corn was moving freely. In the local cash market No. 2 yellow and No. 2 white, corn were quoted at \$1.42 and \$1.45, cost and freight New York.

The oats market also showed a firmer tone in sympathy with corn, and on further evidences of export buying. Export sales were estimated at about 300,000 bushels to a neutral country. The local cash market was firmer, standard quoted at 57c; No. 2 white, 67 1/2c; No. 3 white, 65c; a 6c; No. 4 white, 65 1/2c; fancy clipped white, 67c a 68 1/2c; ordinary clipped white, 66c a 67c all elevator.

Longuet, will leave for Paris shortly to get in contact with the leading statesmen at the Peace Conference. It is announced that a second Socialist conference probably will be held in Berne early in the summer.
