The committee representing the Scotch Lodges having further stated that those Lodges were at any moment prepared to give their allegiance to the Grand Lodge of Quebec, the committees thought it desirable that a special communication of the Grand Lodge of Quebec should be called at as early a date as practicable for the purpose of receiving the report of their committee, and in order to receive the allegiance of the Scotch holding lodges and granting them new warrants.
