

HODGINS, THOMAS, *M.A., Q.C., [West Elgin.]*

S. of William Hodgins, Esq., of Pembroke Park, Dublin, formerly of the Co. Wicklow, Irel. B. in Dublin. Ed. at Bristol, Eng., and at the University of Toronto, where he obtained first class honors with his degree of B.A., in 1856, and afterwards proceeded to the degrees of LL.B., and M.A. M., 1858, Maria Burgoyne, dau. of John Scoble, Esq., who represented West Elgin in the Can. Assembly, from 1863 until the Union. Called to the Bar, U.C., Hilary Term, 1858. Created Q.C., 1873. Was in the Education Dept., U.C., from 1848 to 1858. Has published Law Manuals on School and Municipal Law, U.C., and was for some time Equity Reporter for the *Law Journal*, U.C. Was one of the founders of University College Literary and Scientific Society, of which he became Presdt., and of the University Association. Apptd. a mem. of the Senate of the University of Toronto, 1872. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at last g.e. A Liberal.—25, Bloor St. West, Toronto.
