Canadian students travelling abroad can obtain student price concessions in 28 countries with the presentation of their International Student Identity Card. The Card enables students to use student hostels (unoccupied university residences), charter flight facilities between major European cities, and gain free, or reduced) admission to many museums and art galleries. Cost: \$1.00.

The Handbook on Student Travel is a valuable pocket guide providing information to the independent travelling student. It lists student hostels and restaurants, and contains other information concerning charter flights within Europe, discounts on rail and bus travel, general price concessions available to students, and information covering hundreds of cities throughout 28 countries. Cost: \$1.00.

The "Travelling Student" includes complete information regarding student flights, transport by bus and special student trains

operated within Europe by the different European student travel bureaux. Fare reductions of 30 to 65% are listed in the booklet. Free.


