this policy will insure a better food service.

He said the university is interested in protecting itself and the students. Mr. Shanks said the companies have indicated this is the "most comprehensive tender package they have ever encounted

The request for tender says that those companies with previous post secondary educational experience will have a distinct advantage. The university also encourages the additional presentation of alternate packages which offer an improvement in the overall quality of services and, or, reduced costs. This would include suggestions as to service levels, menus, decor and equipment, and their submission will be taken into consideration when the bids are being viewed.

The actual bids are due on Feb. 16. The decision of which company or companies will receive which contracts will lie ultimately with the Board of Governors. However, they wil have been considered by both a food contract committee and a sub-food contract committee. Recommendations will be made by these committees and

submitted to the Vice president of Finance and Administration, James O'Sullivan who will then submit them to the Board of Governors.

The Sub Committee is comprised of both students and administrators. It is they who will be doing most of the "legwork" according to Mr. Shanks, who is the secretary. Also on the sub committee are Mr. Goldberg, Eric Garland, the assistant vice president finance and adminis-
