Dixie's Friday night fights make for punchless Sunday

Dixie Beehives suffered their first setback of the season on home ice Sunday night, dropping a 5-2 decision to Richmond Hill Rams.

The roots of the loss, however, date back to Dixie's game Friday with St. Michael's Buzzers. During that evening, Buzzers bombed Beehives 10-4 and the latter lost five regulars in the process.

Four of the players - Vic Stanfield, Mike Belanger, Stu Towers and Rick Cornacchio - received one-game suspensions for participating in a third-period fight.

Ron McNaughton, the fifth, sustained an arm injury. All five missed Sunday's game and their absence was obvious.

Beehive coach Frank Milne, sitting out a three-game sentence of his own, watched Sunday's game as a spectator. He was banished for criticizing the referees in last week's game with St. Mike's.

Milne refused to use the manpower shortage as an excuse. "Four or five players don't make a team. Besides they (Rams) are a second-last place team."

Dixie had four or five excellent chances to score when they were one goal behind. On each occasion they were stopped by Rams' goaler Steve Bushell.

the Richmond Hill goals.

Jim Glover and Gary Young gave Dixie the early lead.

Beehives, who won six and tied two in their home games before Sunday, are currently winless in their last four starts. They have only one tie to show during the period.

Friday, Dixie will travel to Weston for a game with Dodgers. They return to Dixie Arena next Sunday.
