Camp Borden, Ont.	8-6-44		<p>Night flying washed in at 0400 hours. Night flying time 99:05 hours. 0800 hours ceiling unlimited, visibility 12 miles. Flying washed in at 0815 hours. Washed out at 1700 hours. Flying time 343:20 hours. Night flying washed in at 2100 hours.</p> <p>Edenvale: Flying washed in at 0800 hours. Washed out 1630 hours. Flying time 30:30 hours.</p> <p>The Air Officer Commanding No. 1 Training Command, accompanied by S/L McInyneaux attended a bombing competition held at the R.1 Edenvale today. R.C.A.F. Stations Dunnville, Trenton, Aylmer, Uplands and Borden took part in the exciting event. Representing Dunnville were F/L Deolittle and F/O Doerr; Trenton, F/O Bellick and F/O McAllister; Aylmer, F/O Upstrome and F/O Crawford; Uplands, F/L Church and F/O Baker. Camp Borden was represented by F/O Schissler and F/O Spafford. S/L H. Boulter, Command Armament Officer also attended the contest. A.V.M. T.N. Cowley, the A.O.C. presented the trophy, formerly held by No. 2 S.F.T.S. to F/L Deolittle and F/O Doerr of Dunnville, the winning team.</p> <p>A summary of evidence was held at this unit with F/L E.L. Claridge, the Investigating Officer, regarding the charge of desertion of R.192916 LAC Rogers, G.A. who absented himself without leave from 10th Jan. until the 21st May, 1944.</p> <p>The W.D.'s of No. 1 S.F.T.S. assembled in their lounge at 1315 hours today to hear S/O R. Auxiliary Officer found no difficulty in holding every girl's attention during her talk about her work and her experiences.</p> <p>Harvard 11 2911 groundlooped on the Main Aerodrome at 2235 hours. The pilot, F/O H. VanDenBrande and the passenger Woll Lockwood, L.T. were both uninjured. The accident occurred during night weather patrol. It was a D category crash.</p> <p>Harvard FE743 took off from the R.1 at Edenvale at 1300 hours loaded with eight practice bombs. The bombs were accidentally released, exploded and caused slight damage to the aircraft. The pilot F/O G.A. McAllister (J26438) was uninjured. F/O J.C. Phillips, Admin.
