

John King, M.A., K.C.

Born, Toronto, September 15, 1843.  
 Died, Toronto, August 30, 1916.  
 Son of John King (Royal Horse Artillery), born Tyrie, Aberdeenshire, Scotland; and Christina Macdougall, born Glasgow, Scotland.  
 Called to the Bar, 1869.  
 Lecturer to the Law Society of Upper Canada, Ontario Law School, Osgoode Hall, Toronto, 1893 to 1915; and thereafter, to time of death, Lecturer Emeritus.  
 Member of the Senate of the University of Toronto, from 1879 to time of death.  
 Author of "The Law of Libel"; "The Law of Defamation"; "Slander and Libel in Canada"; Law of Criminal Libel"; "McCaul, Croft, Forneri: Personalities of Early University Days"; "The Other Side of the Story"; and papers and pamphlets on the History of Newspaper Libel, Criminal Law of Libel, etc.  
 Honorary member, and for many years Legal Adviser, to the Canadian Press Association.  
 Had much to do with drafting and promoting amendments to the laws of libel, civil and criminal, of the Province and the Dominion.  
 Served in Fenian Raid, 1866.

Isabel Grace Mackenzie King

Born, New York, February 6, 1843.  
 Died, Ottawa, December 18, 1917.  
 Thirteenth and youngest child of William Lyon Mackenzie and Isabel Baxter.  
 Date of marriage, John King to Isabel Grace Mackenzie, December 12, 1872.

Note - John King, the father of John King, served with the Royal Horse Artillery in the Rebellion of 1837. He was in command of a detachment of artillery at Prescott.
