 2nd What is the value
 of the Saw Mill, and whether
 the same is in good order,
 and the machinery suitable
 for working purposes.
 If not what would be the
 cost of repairing the same
 and placing it in a satis-
 -factory condition. The expense
 of obtaining a report in
 respect to these matters
 should be borne by Mr.
 Hoy and you should notify
 him to that effect, but the
 party who makes the in-
 -spection and valuation should
 be selected by you.
