- Q. How far away from the hut would it be?  
A. About 6 feet away.
- Q. You don't know what time it was?  
A. No, Sir, I don't know. We had been on duty for a long time.
- Q. I can understand that. I can understand you being <sup>hazy</sup> unhappy  
about a lot of things. You gave a lot of orders that day?  
A. Yes.
- Q. Do you remember them all?  
A. No.
- Q. Was anyone with the accused when you gave the accused the  
order?  
A. I can't remember whether there was or not.

things that are to do with the accused and not about other  
things. Do you remember giving the order?  
A. Yes, Sir.
