Re: Timber - Clayoquot -Ahousat Reserves

Mr. W. R. Knott of the Advance Logging Company of 566 Hornby Street, Vancouver, has requested that his Company be allowed to log off four of the Clayoquot Ahousat Band Indian Reserves; namely No. 17 Chetarpe, 35 acres; No. 18 Sutaquis 27 acres, No. 19 Wahous (Fishery) 143 acres, and No. 20 Wahous (Village) 34 acres.

They wish to log this off under Contract the Indians to supply the timber and their Company to do the logging and shipping. The balance from the sale to be divided equally between the Indians and their Company.

They propose to Raft the logs and have them shipped to Vancouver for sale there. The cost of their operations are as follows:-

Logging (which includes falling, bucking, yarding to water)	\$15.00
Making into Rafts & towing to Vancouver	\$12.00
Insurance, breaking down of rafts & incidentals	3.00
