THE order of the day, for putting the question of concurrence on the amendments reported from a Committee of the whole House, to the Bill for granting to John Molson the exclusive right and privilege of navigating one or more Steam Boats between Quebec and Montreal, on the River Saint Lawrence, being read;

The amendments reported to the Bill were severally read, and the question of concurrence being separately put upon each, they were agreed to by the House.

RESOLVED, that this House doth concur with the Committee, in the amendments reported to the Bill.

ORDERED, that the said Bill, as amended, be engrossed.

The House being informed that Mr. Somerville, Comptroller of the Customs of the Port of Quebec, attended at the Door, he was called in, and, at the Bar, presented to the House, pursuant to an Address of the House to. His Excellency the Governor in Chief, on the 30th day of March, 1808:—
