The bearer, Jeremiah Thomas, was employed by the Commissioners appointed to superintend the erection of a Jail and Court House in Georgetown, to remove a quantity of earth that had been taken out of the Cellar, to prevent the rain from injuring the stone work, and one week to keep fires in the different chimneys of the building, after the contractors had left, to cause the plastering to dry before the frost set in, for which the said Commissioners agreed to pay him Two Pounds Five Shillings for the first service, and Twenty-four Shillings for the latter, which amount the Commissioners beg may be paid by Government.
