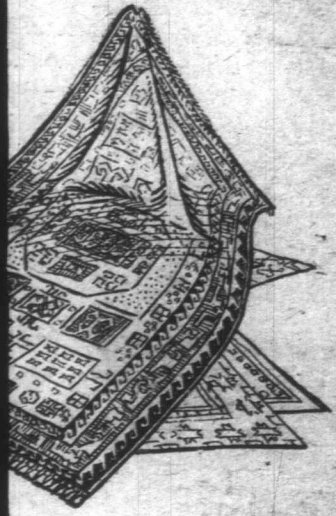

REGINA WINS EXPENSIVE HOLE
Local Lacrosse Team Defeats Calgary Players on Victoria Day Here.

What was expected to be a close game of lacrosse was played in Halfway Park on Monday afternoon, between the Calgary team which is the champion of the Western Canada League and the Regina team. The game was not a good exhibition of Canada's national game. In fact it was a poor game. There were only a few examples of good combination play, while there were many instances of rough work.

The Regina team had the better of the game all the way through. Their goal keeper saved many a ball from being scored. Regina scored 2 in the first quarter, 4 in the second, none in the third and 3 in the last. Calgary only succeeded in scoring once and that was in the last quarter.

Driving Club Races

The races conducted under the management of the Regina Driving Club drew a large crowd to the exhibition grounds on Victoria day in the forenoon. Only local horses contested.

W. Pettigall acted as starter, and Dr. Armstrong and Thos. Hunter acted as judges.

Situation at Ottawa.

The position of affairs at Ottawa do not appear to have changed very much. Sir Wilfrid at one time appeared to be very willing to back down on the Aylesworth Election Bill, and by parity gained time until Clifford Sifton arrived in Ottawa from his holiday jaunt to Mexico. His appearance in the capital seems to have encouraged and strengthened the western Liberals in the demand for the iniquitous bill, and Sir Wilfrid now does not appear willing to make the required amendments. The opposition are putting up a strong case and will not pass supply until they get a fair measure of justice.

ELECTION PROBABLE

There is every indication that the provincial government will go to the country before this fall. The redistribution bill has been brought down and the Liberals are dividing the province into 30 seats. The country is made up into constituencies of almost every conceivable shape. They are of course drawn up in such a way as to give the Liberals the most advantage. The play of some of the members for to guarantee the bonds of the C.N.R., the Free Text Book and other matters are indications of an early appeal to the country. The position of affairs at Ottawa also has a tendency to make the provincial government secure a favorable verdict before the Ottawa government falls.

Successful Convention

First Provincial Convention of Educationalists a Great Success.

The educational convention held in this city last week was highly gratifying in every respect. The attendance was very large, there being over four hundred teachers present besides a large number of school trustees and others interested in education.

From the primary and elementary sections the teachers no doubt would derive much benefit as some excellent papers were read, followed by interesting discussions.

The administrative section however, was the one in which the most interest was shown. The paper by Mr. Greer of Oxbow on Inspector's Reports drew some very useful discussion which cannot fail to benefit both inspectors and trustees as well as teachers.

On Thursday evening the visitors to the city were entertained by the associated school boards of Regina, when a very pleasant evening was spent.

The convention throughout was attended by Dr. W. A. McIntyre, principal of the Manitoba Normal School. His address was interesting and are bound to leave a deep impression on all those who heard them. His ideas and style are similar to those of Dr. Goggin, who was at one time superintendent of education for the North-West Territories. In fact he was a pupil of Mr. Goggin's and in many ways is a reproduction of that gentleman in educational matters.

Mr. Daniel McIntyre, superintendent of the Winnipeg schools was also present at the convention and took part. A large number of the students who took normal training in Regina since 1892 were at the convention. Those who remained in the city over Saturday were entertained at an At Home in the Normal school on Saturday evening.
