International Bible Lesson for To-Morrow—The Passover — Matthew 26, 17-30.

Golden Text—"For even Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us."

But I say unto you I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day I drink it anew with you in my Father's Kingdom. At Lord's table we take our places as living witnesses between two facts—Jesus' death for us and His coming again for us ere long.

A man and his wife spend only \$1.68 a week in Zion City and thrive on their diet. Wheat, which they get at a feed store, and fruit are the staples of their daily fare. When they wish to enjoy a real feast they lay in a supply of eggs, nuts, dates and figs. This, however, is regarded as extravagant.

Dr. Robert Aiston, a dentist, is the member of Dowie's colony who has systematized his diet theories. He is six feet tall and muscular. Naturally, he doesn't carry any superfluous flesh. Yesterday he announced the cost of his housekeeping.

When the dentist decided to adopt a scientific diet he investigated the food question. He found there were 57 varities that humans consumemostly unfit to eat.

"Why," he asked, "should any sane person eat cabbage? It only contains 4 per cent. of nutriment, while wheat contains 97 per cent.

We buy wheat at the feed store. For 10 cents we get enough for 30 meals for one person. We put the grain in a vessel of salt water and let it slowly simmer over a fire for several hours. To be perfect, whole wheat should cook all one day and be eaten the next. We eat the wheat with cream and sugar."

Potatoga are regarded by the dentist as a fair article of diet because they contain 40 per cent. of nutrition. But he won't eat them fried because they are hard to digest that way. He has them baked or boiled. Tea, coffee and similar trinks are on the boycotted list.

Mrs. Aiston favors the simple diet. She says it makes housekeeping easy.
