Death's Harvest.

The death of Mr. James R. Blanchard, of Upper Dyke Village, took place very suddenly at Kentville on Monday last. He had driven from his farm and was in Pastime Hall when he complained of a severe pain in the region of the heart and expired almost immediately.

On New Year's night, the death occurred at Port Williams, of Lydia A. Faulkner, wife of Absolam Faulkner. Her death was an unexpected shock to her family and community as up to a few minutes before the end she appeared in usual health.

The death occurred at Truro about 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon of Sylvester G. Chambers, president of the Chambers Electric Light and Power Company, Ltd. Although his death was expected the end came very suddenly.

Two Baptist Clergymen Called Home.

Rev. Hibbert Binney Smith, M. A., for the last three years pastor of the United Baptist church at Hbrou, died Monday night, January 17th, of pneumonia in his 58th year. He leaves a widow and daughter. The news of his death came as a shock to the whole community as he was generally liked and respected, not only in the Baptist circles, but with the people in other denominations.

News was received on Tuesday of the death in Iowa of Rev. H. G. Colpitts, who was graduated from Acadia in 1900. He was well known in this province as a Baptist minister, and was at one time pastor in New Minas.
