Rev. Billy Sunday Fires Hot Shot For "Isms and Schisms" at Boston

Says Christian Science is all Tommy Rot and Fol-de-rol.

20th CENTURY IS TOO ENLIGHTENED

"I Preach the Gospel and You Are Black Hearted if You Say I Don't."

Hot shot for "isms and schisms" was fired by Billy Sunday in one of his sermons at Boston. He took his text from Timothy II, 15: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

Early in the preaching Mr. Sunday did not get the close attention that he desired, so he said:

"Look at me. I can't preach when you're looking at someone else. I don't care to be windjamming just for the fun of it."

"We seem to be living in a new era," declared Mr. Sunday. "There never has been a time when the people were more self-satisfied, self-complacent, self-centred than they are today. Some imagine God Almighty will condone what evil they do."

"The average man as soon as he gets a bank account, puffs up like a poisoned pup and thinks he can do anything he likes if he goes to church on Sunday and sings hymns and puts collection in the plate."

"I tell you the man's a fool who thinks he can square himself by appearing good on Sunday and cheat his neighbor the rest of the week. Why, all the good you can do can't counter-balance one bit of evil you do."

Character Never Saved Anyone. "Character never saved anyone. It is only faith in Jesus Christ. You hear the rankest kind of isms and schisms. But you can't improve God's plan of salvation, with all your religious poppycock."

"We got Eddysim; they label it Christian Science. And of them all, that is the worst fol-de-rol of the lot; the worst tommyrot that ever came down the pike. I have read 'Science and Health.' O, yes, I have read everything they have ever printed."

"I tell you what Christian Science says: 'There is no matter. Matter is non-existent, an illusion of the mortal mind.' Then why eat? Why wear clothes? Why advertise in the newspapers? Why ask the people to come around and buy your commodities, to buy their groceries and their meat from you? If matter is non-existent, and there is no disease, why have Christian Science healers?"

"I have not been able to figure that out yet. Christian Science says that man is immune from sin; the Bible says all have sinned and come short of the glory of God. Christian Science says that man is never sick; the Bible says they brought to Him all manner of sick and He healed their disease."

"Christian Science says there is no death; the Bible says it is appointed once to die, and after death, judgment. Christian Science says man is non-existent with God; the Bible says as for man, his days are as grass, as the flowers of the field, so he flourishes."

"Christian Science says the Virgin Mary conceived an ideal of God and gave him the name of Jesus. Such an insult to God Almighty! That Mary should conceive this ideal and name her ideal Jesus, and he was Jesus because she thought he was."

"Why, according to that, all you've got to do is to imagine your kid is Jesus and it is Jesus."

"All in" for Eternity. "A lot of doctrines are contrary to the Word of God. If a man doesn't repent before the undertaker pumps embalming fluid into him he's all in

for eternity. Some people think you can take God on the installment plan. Thank God such a rotten, hellbound doctrine will not prevail.

"We have Millennium Dawnism or Russellism or Watch Tower and International Bible Students, as they say in their advertisements. They do not seek to convert sinners to Jesus Christ, but to pervert saints from truth. Why, it denies the divinity of Jesus and eternal life of His followers. I've got eternal life now as sure as I'm standing on this platform."

"It makes God out a liar, offers no present repentance, but says repentance is possible after death. If you don't settle it now and here there's no chance to do it after this life. With all its evangelical belief, and no matter what it calls itself, it is turning people from Christ."

"Some men make their homes a lodging house and a lunch counter. Like the father whose little girl asked her mother one day: 'Who's that fellow who stays here on Sundays?' (Prolonged laughter and applause). They rush to theatres and lodges and business."

"And we have the pernicious influence of fiction. I wish I could sentence to death fifty popular writers who have been turning the people away from Jesus Christ. Each one has some hare-brained, fantastic idea of a religion which they use all with the same purpose, to fight Jesus Christ."

"You know a man has printed a book, and they buy it so fast they can't turn it off the press fast enough in which he advocates that marriage should not be a life contract, but on the installment plan, like you buy furniture."

Raps Immigrants. "Another influence against Christ is immigration. A lot of people get into this country with just money enough and moral enough to get by the law. They're carabuncles on the body politic, many of them. I'll be the first to stand at Ellis Island and welcome those who come to America to live American lives, but not if they come to supplant our idea of the Sabbath with the continental Sunday."

"America is becoming the back door yard into which Europe is dumping paupers and criminals."

"My mother came from Scotch and Welsh stock, and my father was of sax-Coburg, and I will be among the first to stand at Ellis Island and extend the hand of welcome to any man or woman who wants to come here and assimilate our ways and conditions and live beneath the Stars and Stripes, but so help me God, if I will yield to any class or clique."

"But if they don't like it here let 'em go back to the land where they were kenneled. Sixty-nine per cent of our criminals are either foreigners or of foreign parents."

"You walk the streets of New York or Philadelphia or Chicago and not one out of three faces will have in them the strains of pure Americanism. I can go up on the Manhattan Building and in a radius of 20 miles see where one-eighth of our population lives. They turn our idea of the Sabbath into the continental idea, with their beer gardens and beer drinking."

"Listen to me. To hear some mutts talk you can't tell whether man came from the Garden of Eden or from a zoological garden."

"There are ethical culture people

and higher criticism people and a lot of others too enlightened for the old doctrines. If the 20th century is too enlightened for the old doctrines then I say to Hell with the 20th century."

Attacks Liberal Churches. "This tabernacle is a halfway house between the brownstone-front church and the Salvation Army. But both of those are necessary."

"All the mistakes I have ever made I have made by temporizing with the devil. Whenever I have bowed and truckled and ducked for fear of criticism I have failed."

"Evangelical creeds are needed. Every great religious awakening has been brought about by the proclamation of some great Scriptural truth. Salvation by faith! If you don't repent you'll go to Hell."

"You can't put folks into Heaven by reformation or philanthropy or character. Not with any glittering generalities or rhetorical niceties, nor by any veneer on the sterner side of the Gospel. Humanitarianism is exalted. Mere morality is put at a premium. But these never gripped the heart of the old world or moved the arms of God."

"You'll wreck your faith on the shallow reef of liberalism. Any church that is not evangelistic owes the country an apology for its useless, Godforsaken existence."

"I am dogmatic. There is a Heaven and a Hell, and a Savior, Jesus Christ."

"Say the first thing you know you'll put the Bible on the scrap heap, throw in the sewer the Deity of Jesus Christ, with some of your laborious dissertations and jumbles of jargon. When you take out the atoning blood of Jesus Christ from my religion you can take the rest of it, too."

"You're moving miracles from fact to myth, from faith to imagination."

"Nothing Doing, Universalists." "These Antichrists do not get recruits from the world, but from the pews. Half the church people have never been consecrated."

"They say all are begotten of one Father. Nothing doing, Universalists."

Mr. Sunday elaborated the Unitarian doctrine as to the deity of Jesus and said: "Nothing doing, Unitarians."

"You won't all be saved. I wish you would. But you won't. I take my stand here on the old cardinal doctrines. I believe in hell, H-E-L-L, if you don't want to hear about Hell don't stick your old pate in here. (Applause.)"

"I preach the Gospel and you're a black-hearted liar if you say I don't. (Sunday had mounted a chair for that declaration.) I'm the most up-to-date preacher you ever saw. (He stood there on the chair with one foot resting on its back.) I believe in improvement, but not in improvement of the Gospel. Many can preach the Gospel better than I can, but none can preach a better Gospel than I do."

(Sunday mounted to his pulpit top as he concluded.) "O, Boston, if I were a dragon fly with 40,000 eyes, I could not see all the human extremities here. If I read aright the signs of the times, and I do, because I read them through the Word of God, it behooves the church of God to stir herself for God as never before in the history of humanity."

Prays for Pulpit Top. "For two reasons, I want to warn you again the heresies that will

sweep people from their feet. I want to encourage you to press on to the very gates of hell, knowing God has never dipped his colors yet to any Godless gang or cult."

"We don't need 'The Sweet Bye and Bye.' We need 'Onward Christian Soldier,' 'Soldiers of the Cross' and the martial airs. Are you ready? I want to see how many God can bank on in Boston. Raise your hands."

(Perhaps 2,000 or 3,000 hands went up.) Sunday then prayed, standing on the pulpit top, looking down—at "Hell"—and up toward Heaven at different stages of his prayer.

"Say, Jesus, thank you for this day and for the strength you've given me. I didn't know whether I'd have enough or not."

"O, Devil, haven't you damned enough yet? Haven't you broken enough mothers' hearts yet? O, devils in Hell, we've fought you for 20 years, and we hope the memory of what we've done will go on fighting."

"O, God, swift as the morning light, may your angels come down and beat back every foe, and we'll shout Hallelujah and Amen and Amen." (Mr. Sunday stepped down to the chair, then to the floor, and sank back in his chair.)

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
