DEFERRED ARTICLES. Rules for the Care of Sheep.

The general agent of the America Emigrant Company gives us the follow 1. Keep sheep dry under foot with litter. This is even more necessary than roofing them. Never let them stand or lie in mud or snew. 2. Take up ram lambs easily in the summer, and keep them up until De-cember 1st, following, when they may be

turned out. Drop or take out the lowest bars thus saving broken limbs. 4. Count every day.

5. Begin graining with the greatest care, and use the smallest quantity at 6. If a ewe lose her lamb, milk her daily, for a few days, and mix a little alum with her salt.

7. Let no hogs eat with the sheep in 8. Give the lambs a little mill feed in time of weaning. 9. Never frighten sheep if possible to

10. Sow rye for weak ones in cold weather if you can. 11. Separate all weak, or thin or sick, from those strong, in the fall, and give them special caro.

12. If any sheep is hurt, catch it at once, and wash the wound; and if it is fly time, apply spirits of turpentine daily, and always wash with something healing. If a limb is broken bind it up with aplinters tightly, loosening as the 13. Keep a number of good bells on

the sheep.

14. Don't let the sheep spoil their 15. Cut tag-locks in early spring.

16. For scours give pulverized alum in wheat bran; prevent by taking great care in changing dry for green feed. 17.
