The Sinister Hand

All the scandals in public matters for the past five years, except the Besco and Liquor Control matters, are connected with Coakerism. And even in the Liquor Control matter, with a solitary exception, the responsibility of the Coaker members of the Government was as complete as that of any other man,

It was as much the fault of the Coaker members as of any other man or men that Meaney was allowed to debauch the Liquor Control business. Were Coaker, Halfyard, Barnes and Cave not as well aware as anybody in the community that the Prohibition Act was being violated, and that frauds were being perpetrated.
