Could Be More Useful to Ireland in an Unofficial Capacity.

London, May 9. - George Wyndham, who had been absent, owing to illness, since his resignation of the Chief Secretaryship for Ireland, returned to the House of Commons today, and made personal explanation of the reasons for his resignation. He said he had insisted on retiring from the cabinet because political and personal reasons had convinced him that he could better serve the Government as an un-official member. His views had not changed in the smallest degree in regard to the Irish administration. Union must be the fundamental principle of any sound policy. The situation in both Ireland and England had become complicated by a personal misunder-standing, for which he himself was partly to blame. He had never contemplated any delegation of legisla-tive power from the House of Commons, other than the power of dealing with purely private bills. Con-sequently he had paid no attention, as he ought to have done, to the earlier proceedings of the Reform Association, Sir Anthony MacDonnell (Under Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland), erroneously believed that he (Wyndham), would approve of the proposals of the devolutionists, but as soon as he saw these pro-posals Mr. Wyndham registered strong objection to them, such misconceptions of his attitude were obstructive in the case of all efforts at social reform. Therefore he had concluded that his power for doing further useful work in Ireland was ended. Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman (the Liberal leader), then moved his reso-

lution, which amounted to a vote of censure of the policy and proceedings of the Irish Government, connected with and subsequent to appointment of Sir Antony MacDonnell. Sir Henry said the Government had attempted a polley of impartial Irish administration on the lines of the Wyndham-MacDonnell letters, but had fled from it at the dictates of a policy, Sir Henry concluded with remarking that as to the future Irish policy mutterings of coercion were heard. Chatham, Ont., May 10. - The court of public investigation concerning the allegations in the matter of dealing with West Kent licenses, ordered by Premier Whitney, and Provincial Government, opens in the council chambers this morning. Great interest centers in the sittings: Endo Saunders, chief of the Government license department, who pre-

sides, is invested with full judicial powers. Crown Attorney Smith is in charge of the court procedure. Deputy Sheriff Beston is looking after the witnesses, and Miss Duke, county court stenographer, will be officially in at-

Among the counsel retained are Mat-thew Nelson, K. C., who is acting for the Provincial Secretary's department; Ward Stanworth, for the license commissioners, and O. L. Lewis, for some of the parties making allegations. A large number of witnesses, many of them prominent politicians, have been subpoenaed. There are rumors afloat that certain witnesses have received subpoenaes, and are absent, but today The commissioners express every satisfaction and confidence with

the investigation. There are two counts to the inquiry. viz., the alleged bribery and attempted bribery of the commissioners, and the alleged interference and dictation of the political party executive.

Prominent citizens of both parties universally commend the Premier and Government for the prompt, fearless and public steps taken to investigate the many ugly rumors afloat.

## BIG MAIL BAG ROBBERY

Wholesale Disappearance of Regis-

tered Letters in Quebec. Quebec, May 9.-The postoffice authorities of this city are very much exercised over the robbery of the mail bags coming from the north shore by the disappearance of a considerable number of registered letters. It has leaked out that a series of robberies connected with the mails from this point have been discovered within the past three weeks, that is puzzling the minds of the inspectors to detect, notwithstanding that the closest vigilance of the officials has been practiced to apprehend the guilty parties.

Some days ago, when the steamer King Edward arrived here with the usual mails from the different post-offices along the north shore, it was discovered on examination of the sacks from River Pentecost, that one of them had been ripped open, and out of the forty registered letters that it was supposed to contain, thirty-three were missing. Immediately measures were taken by the authorities to discover those guilty of the robbery, but


