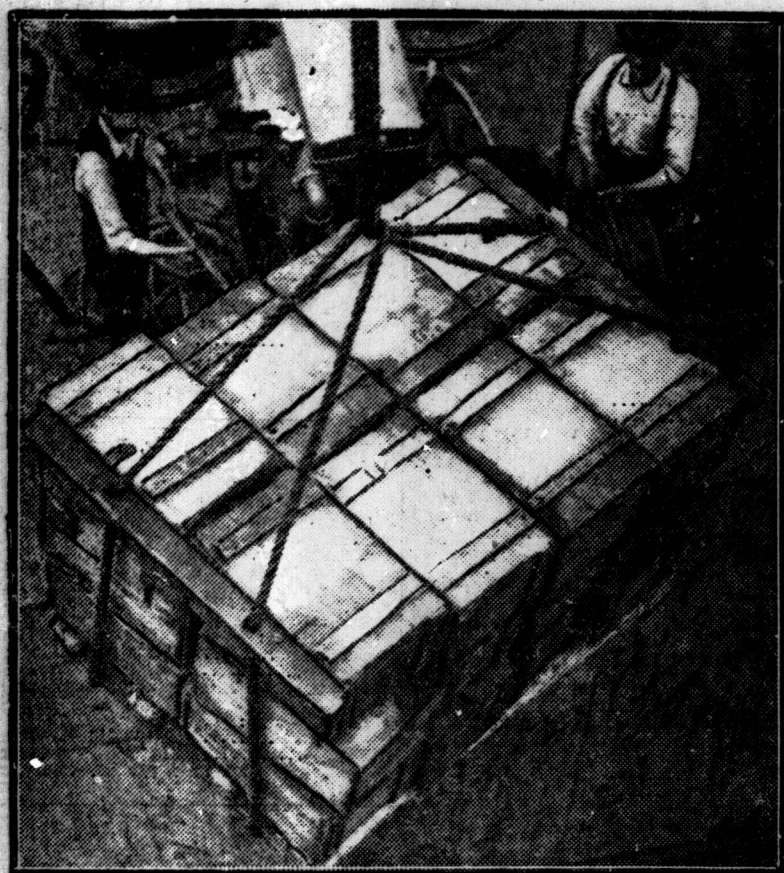
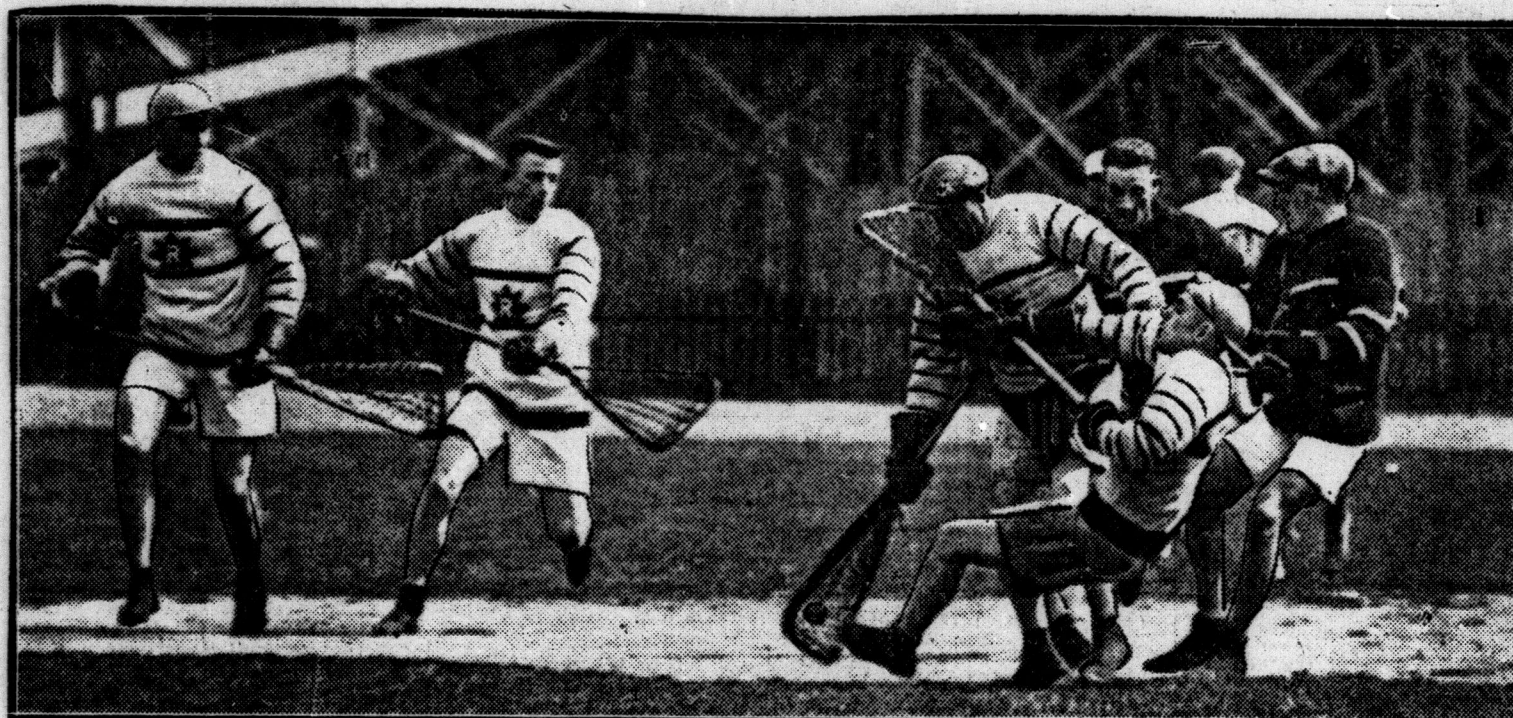

A trio of fair damsels set out to hike to the Dempsey-Gibbons fight. They found this too tiresome and arrived at their destination via the side-door Pullmans.



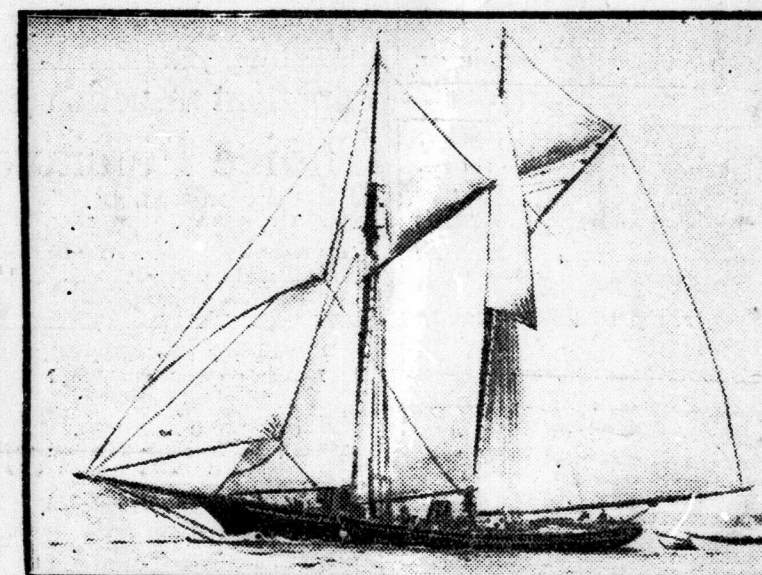
Gen. Sir H. Trenchard, who will take charge of the training of the 34 new British air squadrons which have recently been authorized.

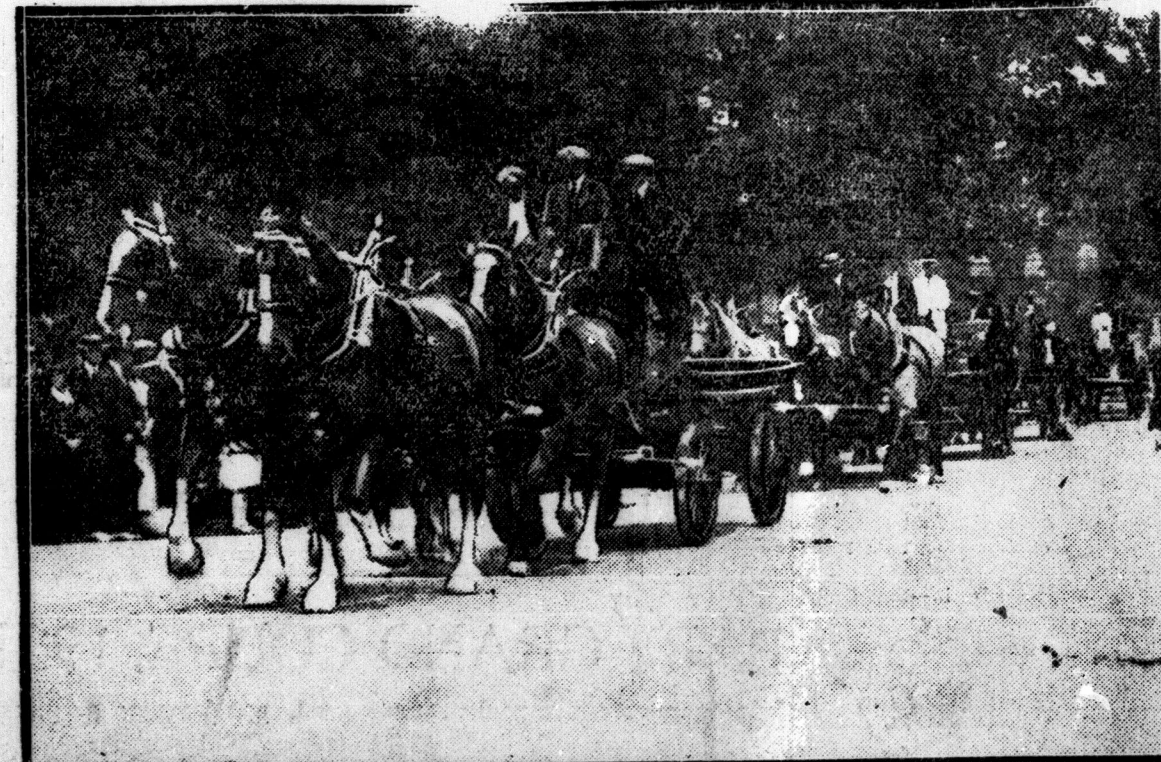
Harold Lloyd, famous film comedian, de-goggled. With him is his bride, Mildred Davis, and the couple say they are still honeymooning.
