Past and Present

The method used to obtain men for the Royal Navy by Captain Guiness is very different to that which prevailed in the days of Nelson when the "Press. gang" was used; the Navy was not as it is now a popular service even in Nelson's day, and in order to get a full crew for a new ship it was not an uncommon thing for the Captain to send a few of his heartles ashore with an offleer to press men into the service. In this way men were forcibly taken officer to press men into the service. In this way men were forcibly taken from their homes at a moments' notice and placed on board one of the King's ships to work as a sailor until he could buy himself out by paying a ubstitute.
